US Privacy Policy

PURPOSE OF THIS PRIVACY POLICY

Your privacy is important to us. This Privacy Policy describes the types of information that we collect from and about you when you visit this site or any other of our websites where this policy is posted (collectively, our "Sites") or otherwise interact with us or request Services from us as described further in this Privacy Policy. This Privacy Policy also explains how we may use and disclose such information, as well as your ability to control certain uses of your Personal Information.

The following policy applies to anyone who is not a resident of the European Economic Area ("EEA"). If you are a resident of the EEA, click <u>here</u>.

By visiting our Sites or using any of our Services, you signify that you have read and understand this Privacy Policy and consent to the collection, use, and disclosure of your Personal Information as described in this Privacy Policy. If you do not, please do not use our Sites or our Services.

For the purposes of this Privacy Policy, Personal Information is defined under applicable law and includes information that identifies you or your device or can be reasonably associated with you.

PERSONAL INFORMATION WE COLLECT OR RECEIVE

Collection of Personal Information When You Interact with Our Sites and Services

We may collect the following categories of Personal Information about our customers, potential customers, and visitors to our Sites when you (i) use our search function, (ii) create an online account with us, (iii) request a quote from us, (iv) apply for employment with us, (v) request a demo from us, (vi) register a product with us, (vii) provide information to one of our sales coordinators, (viii) speak with one of our representatives by phone, (ix) sign up for newsletters or our email list, (x) participate in a survey or promotion, or (xii) request information from us or otherwise contact us.

We may collect the following categories and specific pieces of Personal Information for the following business purposes:

We collect this Personal Information directly from you in a variety of instances, including through forms on our Sites, through cookies and other technologies, and through your interactions with us or our service providers in writing, in person, by telephone or other electronic means.

Information Collected from Third Parties or Other Sources

We may obtain Personal Information about you from third parties or other sources, and we may combine this information with the information we collect from and about you through our Sites or our Services. Such information may include, but is not limited to:

- Information obtained through communications that you make through a third party;
- Any other information obtained through companies that have business relationships with us, such as our licensees, affiliates, and business partners.

We may also collect information about you from other online sources, including when you connect with us through our official corporate pages on third party social networks (such as Facebook) or the "apps" on those pages. This information may include, but is not limited to, name, username, demographic information, updated address or contact information, interests, and publicly-observed data, such as from social media and online activity. We may combine this information with the information we collect from and about you through our Sites or our Services.

Our Collection of Information via Cookies and other Technologies

A cookie is a commonly used automated data collection tool. Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer or device by websites that you visit or HTML-formatted emails you open, in order to make websites work, or to work more efficiently. To learn more about cookies, including

USING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

We may use the information we collect from and about you for any of the following business or commercial purposes:

- To validate, confirm, verify, and track your account, products or Services (including to contact you about your account, products or services);
- To enhance your online experience, including as a way to recognize you and welcome
 you to our Sites, make the account usage faster and smoother and provide you with
 customized Site content, targeted offers advertising on our Sites (including geo-targeted
 advertising), or via email, telephone, text message, or by mail;
- To recognize your online activities over time and across different websites and devices;
- To contact you with information, newsletters, promotional materials and contests from us or on behalf of our business partners, licensees, and affiliates;
- To use your data in an aggregated non-specific format for analytical and demographic purposes;
- To review the usage and operations of our Sites, and improve our content, products, and services;

WHAT INFORMATION WE SHARE

In order to provide you with our goods and services and for our business purposes, we may share your Personal Information with our affiliates and/or third parties that provide services to us and/or our affiliates, including the following categories of recipients:

- Our Affiliates: To other member companies that are affiliated with bioMérieux, SA.
- Our Service Providers: To contractors, service providers, and other third parties we use
 to support our business or in connection with the administration and support of our
 business activities and who are bound by contractual obligations to keep Personal
 Information confidential and use it only for the purposes for which we disclose it to them
 (e.g., database hosting providers, managed services providers, developers, consultants).
- In Connection with Corporate Events/Transitions: To a buyer or other successor in the event of a merger, divestiture, restructuring, reorganization, dissolution, or other sale or

transfer of some or all of our assets, whether as a going concern or as part of bankruptcy, liquidation, or similar proceeding, in which Personal Information held by us about our Site users is among the assets transferred.

- Third Party Servicers: To fulfill the purpose for which you provide it. For example, if you ask us to communicate information to a third in order to service a product affiliated with us
- To Comply with Legal Requirements, Cooperate with Law Enforcement, Prevent Fraud or Other Crimes, and to Protect Our Legal Rights Your Legal Rights or the Legal Rights of Others: If we are under a duty to disclose or share your Personal Information in order to comply with any legal and tax requirements, or in order to enforce or apply our terms of use and other agreements, including for billing and collection purposes; or to protect our or others' rights, property, or safety. This may include exchanging information with other companies and organizations for the purposes of fraud protection and credit risk reduction.
- Additional Third Parties as Directed or Disclosed: For any other purpose disclosed by us when you provide your information or with your consent when required by applicable law and regulations.

We may also share aggregate or anonymous non-personal information with third parties for their marketing or analytics uses.

We do not sell Personal Information and do not have actual knowledge of any "sales" of Personal Information of minors under the age of 16. We will never disclose your Personal Information except as defined in this Privacy Policy.

YOUR CONTROL OVER YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

We provide all of our customers with the opportunity to opt-out of having their Personal Information used for purposes not directly related to purchase, processing, registration or ongoing services. YOUR CALIFORNIA RIGHTS

To the extent that it applies to the Personal Information we collect about you, the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA) amended by California Privacy Right Act (CPRA) provides California residents and/or their authorized agents with specific rights regarding the collection and storage of their Personal Information.

Your Right to Know: California residents have the right to request that we disclose the following information to you about our collection and use of your Personal Information over the past twelve (12) months. We may ask you to provide certain information to identify yourself so that we may compare it with our records in order to verify your request. Upon verification, we will disclose to you:

1. The categories of Personal Information we have collected about you.

- 2. The categories of sources for the Personal Information we have collected about you (e.g., use of cookies, third parties, etc.).
- 3. Our business or commercial purpose for collecting or selling your Personal Information.
- 4. The categories of third parties with whom we share or have shared that Personal Information.
- 5. The specific pieces of Personal Information we have collected about you (also called a data portability request).
- 6. The categories of third parties to whom we have sold or shared your Personal Information, if any, and the categories of Personal Information that we have shared with each third-party recipient, we will provide you with two separate lists disclosing:
 - a. Sales, identifying the Personal Information categories that each category of recipient purchased; and
 - a. Disclosures for a business purpose, identifying the Personal Information categories that each category of recipient obtained.

Your Right to Delete: California residents have the right to request that we delete any of the Personal Information collected from you and retained by us, subject to certain exceptions. We may ask you to provide certain information to identify yourself so that we may compare it with our records in order to verify your request. Once your request is verified and we have determined that we are required to delete the requested Personal Information in accordance with the CCPA, we will delete, and direct our third-party service provides to delete, your Personal Information from their records. Your request to delete Personal Information that we have collected may be denied if we conclude it is necessary for us to retain such Personal Information under one or more of the exceptions listed in the CCPA.

Verifying Your Request: Only you, or a person that you authorize to act on your behalf, may make a request related to your Personal Information. Verifying your request will require you to provide sufficient information for us to reasonably verify that you are the person about whom we have collected Personal Information or a person to act on your behalf. We will only use the Personal Information that you have provided in a verifiable request in order to verify your request. As stated above, we cannot respond to your request or provide you with Personal Information if we cannot verify your identity or authority. Please note that we may charge a reasonable fee or refuse to act on a request if such request is excessive, repetitive or manifestly unfounded.

"Shine the Light" and "Eraser" Laws: Residents of the State of California may request a list of all third parties to which we have disclosed certain information during the preceding year for those third parties' direct marketing purposes. Non-Discrimination: You will not receive any discriminatory treatment by us for the exercise of your privacy rights conferred by the CCPA.

Non-affiliated third parties are independent from us and if you wish to receive information about your choices or rights in relation to those third parties or to stop communications from such third parties, you will need to contact those non-affiliated third parties directly.

LINKS TO THIRD PARTY WEBSITES

Our Sites and email messages from us may contain links to third-party websites, which may have privacy policies that differ from our own. You should be aware that the collection, retention and use of any data you provide on these websites will be governed by the privacy policy of the company providing the website and not by this policy. We are not responsible for the practices of such websites.

PUBLIC FORUMS

Any information you may disclose on our Sites, in blogs, on message boards, in chat rooms, or on other public areas on our Sites, or other third-party website that our Sites may link to, becomes public information. Please exercise caution when disclosing Personal Information in these public areas. We reserve the right to remove any posting or content in a posting at our sole discretion.

CHILDREN'S PRIVACY

Protecting children's privacy is important to us. We do not direct our Sites, nor do we knowingly collect any Personal Information from, children under the age of thirteen. If we learn that a child under the age of thirteen has provided Personal Information to us, we will use reasonable efforts to remove such information from our files.

DATA SECURITY

Although no system or website can guarantee the complete security of your information, we take commercially reasonable steps to ensure your information is protected in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations, as appropriate to the sensitivity of your information. However, no electronic data transmission can be guaranteed to be secure from access by unintended recipients and Company will not be responsible for any breach of security unless this breach is due to its negligence. Although we are committed to employing reasonable technology in order to protect the security of our website, even with the best technology, no website is 100% secure. In transacting business with us through our website, you assume the risk inherent in transacting business online.

DATA STORAGE

Your Personal Information may be stored on servers in the United States and is subject to the laws of the United States, where the data protection and other laws may differ from those of other countries. Your Personal Information may be disclosed in response to inquiries or requests from government authorities or to respond to judicial process in the countries in which we operate. If we transfer Personal Information from one country to another, we will ensure that the information is transferred in accordance with this Privacy Policy, and as permitted by applicable data protection laws.

REVISIONS TO THIS PRIVACY POLICY

We reserve the right, at its sole discretion, to change, modify, add, remove, or otherwise revise portions of this Privacy Policy at any time. If we do, we will make you aware of the change(s) on our Sites by including a link to the previous version of the Privacy Policy. Your continued use of

our Sites following the posting of changes to these terms means you accept these changes. If we change this Privacy Policy in a material way, we will provide appropriate notice to you.
